Real Cédula, June 9, 1698. (Vol. 28, p. 69)
About the situado of Florida. Neglect of Province. Appeal
of Gov. Laureano de Torres y Ayala. Order: send situado.

56v - 57v:

Real Cédula, July 10, 1704. (Vol. 32, p. 87)
About help to Florida against invasion of English. Gives some
details of Moore's Raid on Apalache.

58v - 58v:

Real Cédula, Aug. 22, 1704. (Vol. 32, p. 99)
About English invasions of Florida. Refers to reports of Gov.
Zuniga y Cerda about the invasions of 1702 and 1704. Brief
description of destruction of Ayubale, killing of one friar,
imprisonment of natives, death by fire to others. Plan to re-
inforce Province. Appointment of Andres de Arriola to lead
expedition to dislodge English from Carolina.

61 - 62:

Real Cédula, Aug. 12, 1705. (Vol. 32, p. 374)
Refers to letters of May 30, Sept. 20, and 26, 1704 giving ac-
counts of aid sent to Florida (3 embarcaciones from Veracruz)
in charge of Andres de Arriola; his attempts to succor Teniente
of Apalache; ships couldn't enter the river because of bars;
sent aid by falua from Pensacola. Aid given to Mobile also.
Accidental burning of fort at Pensacola. Order: strengthen all
forts on Gulf of Mexico.

63 - 64:

Real Cédula, Feb. 10, 1708. (Vol. 33, p. 325)
Refers to letter of June 6, 1706, telling of continued inva-
sions of Apalache by English and Indians; withdrawal of gar-
rison to Pensacola. Begging additional help, soldiers, arms.
Burning of pueblos and "casafuerte" of Apalache. Aid sent by
Admiral of Armada to Apalache. Present fear of English in
Carolina that Spanish will retaliate from St. Aug. Order:
send situado; reestablish Apalache; fortify province. Tempo-
rary suspension of plans to invade Carolina.

64 - 65:

Real Cédula, Dec. 4, 1709. (Vol. 34, p. 205)
Refers to letter of Feb. 5, 1708 telling of aid received by
Santa Maria de Galve from Mexico in 1707; brought by Arriola.
English invasion of Pensacola immediately after withdrawal of
Arriola. Order: send additional aid to Pensacola.

66 - V:

Real Cédula, Aug. 4, 1713. (Vol. 36, p. 112)
Refers to 3 letters of Viceroy Linares, Oct. 30 & Dec. 15, 1711
and 1712, in which (1) stating needs of Gov. of Pensacola for
aid, (2) acknowledging receipt of aid sent, (3) gave report of
surprise of presidio of Pensacola by Eng. and Indian, death of
one religious, capture of another. Order: send immediate aid.

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77 :

Real Cédula, March 13, 1719. (Vol. 40, p. 82)
Giving account of visit of Cacique of Caveta to St. Aug.
Refers to letter of Gov. of Fla. "de veinte de proximo pasado"
(March 20, 1718?). Order: make efforts to procure friendship
of Indians living on confines of Florida.

93v - 96:

Real Cédula, Sept. 20, 1721. (Vol. 42, p. 175)
About reoccupation of Pensacola, strengthening of Texas. Plans
for opening up canal through Santa Rosa Island, Pensacola, to
drain Bay. Recommends re-population of Apalache to supply forts
with food. Now 20 years without inhabitants. Order: send info-
rmation about fort at Bahia San Jose, 3 years occupied by the
Spanish, Useless?

124 - 125:

Real Cédulas, Oct. 20, 1729. (Vol. 48, p. 265)
About threats of English of Carolina to attack Fla. Order:
aid Florida at once.

128 - V:

Real Cedula, July 26, 1733. (Vol. 52, p. 157)
Send engineer to Presidio of Fla. to reconiter Apalache to
determine best place to erect fort and town.

133v - 134:

Real Cédula (copy), Feb. 27, 1739. (Vol. 59, p. 37)
Article 2 of treaty of peace with England. "Description of
the limits of Florida and Carolina." (States that each pro-
vince shall maintain status quo without new fortifications or
posts being added.) Notify gov. of Fla.

134v - 135:

Real Cédula, Feb. 27, 1739. (Vol. 59, p. 39)
About aid sent to Florida. Suspension of campaign against
Georgia. Pay to troops in Florida (8 companies). Aid to Fla.

135 - 136v:

Real Cédula, Sept. 6, 1739. (Vol. 59, p. 344)
Florida. War with Kaovitas Indians. Strengthen fort San
Marcos in Apalache. Precautions against Georgia. Oglethorpe
to settle Guale area (southern Georgia.)

Fs. 349v - 350:

Real Cédula, Aug. 3, 1646. To Viceroy of New Spain. (Vol. 2, p. 122) In re. Nicolás Ponce de León, Contador de Real Hacienda del Presidio de la Florida. Stating that the same passed to Mexico five years ago to collect the situados for Florida and has been detained there ever since. Meanwhile his wife and family in St. Augustine are in dire need. Order to Viceroy to dispatch the same Nicolás Ponce de León to Fla. immediately to fulfill his duties to his family and office.

Fs. 355v - 356v:

Real Cédula, Oct. 5, 1664. (Vol. 7, p. 156) To the Viceroy of New Spain. Quoting in full Real Cédula of Aug. 29, 1660 (Vol. 6, p. 159) which ordered the Viceroy to make an investigation as to the ways and means of best fortifying the Province of Apalache. It refers to letters of governors of Florida, Alonso de Aranguiz y Cobtes and Diego de Rebolledo, offering recommendations on the matter. Ordered Viceroy and Gov. of Havana to send aid to Fla. Aid requested in above cedula had not been sent; refers to letter of Dn. Nicolas Ponce de Leon, Feb. 19, 1664 (Gov. ad interim of Fla.) to this effect. Soldiers badly needed at St. Aug. must be sent to guard Apalache. Ordering Viceroy to report "muy pronto" on ways and means of fortifying Apalache.

Fs. 361:

Real Cédula, Jan. 29, 1669. (Vol. 10, p. 97) Refers to letter received in Consejo from "Cont'r" of Florida, dated May 4, 1668, giving notice that R. Officials in St. Aug. have detained an Englishman named Enrique (Henry Woodward), natural of London, age 20, whom an English ship disembarked among the Indians 70 leagues from St. Aug. in the year 1665. Letter states that if no order to the contrary is received the prisoner will be sent to Spain with flota or galleons to be turned over to Casa de Contratacion in Seville. King states satisfaction with Gov's plan. Orders Viceroy to send aid immediately to Gov. of Fla. (Complete digest of cedula.)

Fs. 362v - V:

Real Cédula, April 10, 1669. (Vol. 10, p. 113) To Viceroy. In re request of Francisco de la Guerra y de la Vega, Gov. of Fla. for increase in number of plazas. Asks 100 more soldiers. Although number granted at present is 300, it is not sufficient, of this number 43 must go to missionaries, (i.e. plazas). Scarcely 200 soldiers, many very old, some with 30 or 40 years service. Necessity of defending Fla. from pirates, etc. Order: increase number of soldiers by 50.

Fs. 367 - 368:

Real Cédula, Feb. 22, 1676, (Vol. 15, p. 27) To Viceroy: In re. his letter of July 15, 1675 stating request of Sarg. Mayor, Dn. Pedro Benedicto Riutener of Fla. for situado for that province of 350 plazas, also gastes and limosnas for religious and Indian caciques. Order: send 300 plazas, send other 50 to Havana. Lower amount sent to misioners.

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368v - 369v, :

Real Cedula, Nov. 5, 1677. (Vol. 15, P. 381)
To Viceroy of New Spain. Refers to letter of Pablo Hita y Salazar, Gov. of Fla., Aug. 24, 1675, about great necessity of erecting a fort in Apalache for the protection and reduction of the Indians as well as to expel the English from San Jorge. This was ordered in cedula, June 20, 1676, i.e. to send information on type and size of fort needed. Refers also to letters of former governor, Manuel de Cendoya, of Nov. 6, 1671 and Dec. 15, 1672; also to information supplied the Court by Francisco de la Guerra y de la Vega, Jan. 25, 1673.
Order: Send information as to place to fortify Port of Apalache, type of fort needed, number of soldiers, if port needs to be opened to accommodate ships, send map and plans, etc.

369v - 370v;

Real Cedula, Dec. 13, 1677. (Vol. 15, p. 402)
To Viceroy: Quoting in full Real Cedula of April 2, 1676 (Vol. 15, p. 78) in re neglect of Florida: Supplies, corn, being exhausted, had to get small shipment of corn from Apalache and the "vecinos" and soldiers of St. Aug. Order: send situado (10,000 ps.) and necessary supplies six months in advance. Refers to letter of Gov. Manuel de Cendoya, Dec. 15, 1672, telling that Viceroy Mancera had sent 12,000 pesos for building stone fort at St. Aug. indicated that annual grant would be 10,000. Not sufficient. Gov. requests 16,000 pesos year; claims that thus work can be completed in four years. Order: since work on fort is not advanced, as testified by Gov. Hita y Salazar, and R. Officials, complete and fulfill aid to Fla. in form stated in enclosed cedula of April 2, 1676.

373 - 375:

Real Cedula, Dec. 4, 1680. (Vol. 18, p. 189)
About testimony of Pablo de Hita Salazar, March 6, 1680, in reference to gifts given to Caciques and "Indios Amigos comarcanos". In past ten years only 11,777 pesos expended. Great need to continue these gifts. Missionaries' work being retarded, by failure of gifts. Order: Send account of why allotment was stopped by R. Fiscal. Send allotment yearly with situado.

375 - 377:

Real Cedula, Dec. 24, 1680. (Vol. 18, p. 192)
To Viceroy, Pareded: About letters of Aug. 6, 1676, which gave account of a pirate raid on St. Aug., and July 21, 1678, telling about poverty of infantry. R. Cedula, April 6, 1679 had ordered 50 infantry above dotacion of 300 to be sent.
Order: R. Ced. April 6, 1679 hereby revoked. Send dotacion for 350 soldiers. Avoid past frauds and discounts which have taken place in Mexico. Send account of distribution of situado each year. Have R. Official from Fla. reside in Mex. to collect situado each year. Send account to Crown immediately.

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Fs. 393 - 394:

Real Cédula, May 26, 1687 (Vol. 21, p. 263)
To the Viceroy (Monclova). Refers to arrival at Cadiz of a "fragatilla" dispatched by Gov. of Fla., Juan Marques Cabrera. The ship, captained by Juan de Ayala Escobar, arrived Dec. 30, 1686, carrying letters referring to different matters of Florida.
-- Number of soldiers; request to order dotation of soldiers to prov. in filled to number allowed, 350. At present only 111 soldiers in the Castillo and 110 scattered over province. Gov. petitions "se le embien doscientos Ynfantes, y cincuenta, mas de la dotacion y tres Capitanes de Ynfanteria". The two captains at the Presidio are both over 75 years old.
-- 100 soldiers will be sent in the ship with Ayala. Also two new Captains: los Ayudantes, Antonio Matheos y Jose de Berambre.
-- Juan de Ayala named as captain of a third company for Fla.
-- Salary of captains to be 200 ducats each plus 2½ reales a day in rations.
Order: Increase situado of Fla. for the present. In re disposition of the plazas. amounts to go to the five captains and to the "plazas sencillas".
-- Announcing appointment of Captain of "Caballos Corazas", Dn. Diego de Quiroga y Losada, as Gov. of Fla. to succeed Cabrera. He is to leave for Fla. in Ayala's ship which will embark with the Flota.
Order: Send an account of completion of above. (To Viceroy)

Fs. 397v - 401:

Royal Cédula, Sept. 30, 1687. (Vol. 21, p. 367)
To the Viceroy (Monclova). Quoting in full Real Cédula of Dec. 26, 1680 granting permission to secular priests of Cuba to pass to Florida to convert Indians of Province of Carlos. This cédula a reply to appeal of Gov. Pablo Hita Salazar for same.
-- Refers to letter of Juan Marques Cabrera, Oct. 10, 1682, stating that account of above cédula sent to Gov. and Bishop of Cuba. Bishop replied 11 days before his death that 8 priests, including Juan de Cisneros "canonigo mas antiguo" were anxious to begin missionary work in Fla.
-- Gov. of Cuba failed to give aid as ordered in cédula; also disagreement in secular and eccl. cabildos. No priests have left yet. Testimony to good character of Cisneros, cura in Havana when Franc'o de la Guerra was gov. there; later in Jamaica.
-- Cabrera renews request first made by Gov. Rebolledo, letter Aug. 10, 1655, to make Fla. "abadia", diocese. Also in same he deplored neglect of Fla. by bishops of Cuba. Indians born and die without receiving confirmation. More than 70 years since a bishop visited Fla. [sic. but wrong. Bishops visited Fla. in 1606 and 1674.]
-- Refers to another letter of Cabrera, March 29, 1686, in which among other things, he requests that 10 or 12 priests be sent from Diocese of Cuba to Fla. to convert Indians of Apalachicola, Caveta and Casista. Reason they haven't come is that Gov. of Cuba has not provided the 300 pesos for their passage to Havana as provided by the R. Cédula. Indians willing to be converted and repentant for recent obedience given to English at San Jorge.

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397v - 401 cont'd:
Order: Gov. of Cuba and Bishop and R. Officials of same, each carry out his part as ordered by R. Ced. Dec. 26, 1680, to aid those priests who voluntarily wish to go to new conversions of Fla. to do so as soon as possible. Provide the 300 pesos stipulated by Ced. for their passage "desde Guba hasta la Havana", also supply their expenses from time they leave Cuba until they arrive in Fla. as ordered by same Cedula.
--- Increase situado of Fla. each year by as many plazas as will equal number of priests who arrive. For daily support of priests while in Fla.
