Bishop replied 11 days before his death that 8 priests, including Juan de Cisneros "canonigo mas antiguo" were anxious to begin missionary work in Fla. -- Gov. of Guba failed to give aid as ordered in cedula; also disagreement in secular and eccl. cabildos. No priests have left yet. Testimony to good character of Cismeros, eura in Havana when Franc'o de la Guerra was gov. there; later in Jamaica. -- Cabrera renews request first made by Gov. Rebolledo, letter Aug. 10, 1655, to make Fla. "abadia", diocese. Also in same he deplored neglect of Fla. by bishops of Cuba. Indians born and die without receiving Confirmation. More than 70 years since a bishop visited Fla. Zsic. but wrong. Bishops visited Fla. in 1606 and 1674
